Rwanda:

The children at Rafiki’s villages often benefit from a diagnosis made with our tests. Here’s a photo glimpse into the lives of some kids in Rwanda:



During Rwanda’s genocide memorial time, the 6-8th graders are required to walk to the local genocide memorial.



As they neared the end of the rainy season, all of the sudden most of the kids wanted to create their own gardens and plant seeds.



Papa [bottom right photo] has permission to graze his cows on Rafiki property. {If Rafiki doesn’t use the land for something, the government will take it and use it.} This man's daughter also attends Rafiki’s school as a day student. One day, on a walk with the kids, they wanted to stop to see the cows. “Papa” let the kids touch the cows and also squeeze this cow’s udder to squirt milk. The kids were very apprehensive but they all touched the cow.

Togo:

Several months ago, I had two home-schooled high school kids {Jordan and Silas} join me to learn about SMI and the science behind our diagnostics. We finished off our time with a little assembly work of malaria tests. I invited both of the boys to write their names on some of the tests so I could keep track of where they ended up. Below are some photos from Togo – just one of the end-use countries.



Positive test for malaria

The young girl pictured wrapped in a blanket on a hot July day in Africa was, not surprisingly, positive for malaria. We diagnosed and treated 74 cases of malaria using your kits.
