100,000th test went to Haiti to the Christianville Clinic

And now...drum roll, please...the **400,000th** test has been carried to Niger with Effective Ministries and Link Niger.



Amy wrote: "I just got home from Niger last night. I was there for both a cataract mission and general medical team. Both were excellent missions. The cataract team did 113 surgeries and the medical team did over 150 tests involving blood and needles. We were so thankful to have only one "exposure". The tests with the post exposure kit are still in Niger. We will use them again in February when we are there with the women's maternity mission. The **test was super easy to use** and had a **quick result**. I was happy for that. Hope you are doing well!

Our family is part of an indigenous ministry called Vie Abondante (French for "Abundant Life") here in Niger. The ministry focuses on evangelism, church-planting, discipleship Bible schools, leadership training, Christian primary schools, and well-drilling, just to

name a few. Jonathan is the director of the Bible School in the city where we live, and I homeschool our four children. On the side, whenever possible, I enjoy using my nursing skills to help care for the sick. This picture [bottom left] was taken in front of a stick church building with the members of the church.

Village ministry – we travel to churches in remote villages on Sunday mornings to visit and encourage the believers there.
